What's on the runways and the street? Fiery hues, cool-as-ice gems and golden tiger's-eye



### Paint-box Colors

Designers are combining contrasting gems for a festive look. Such a kaleidoscopic approach works well for monotone ensembles. Pick a pendant with a colorful threesome of stones, or try a necklace overflowing with reds, oranges, yellows, greens, blues, indigos and violets. You can even design your own palette by wearing several single-stone stacking rings.

### Clear Crystal

You've gotta love rock crystal. Not only is it inexpensive and stylish, but it also goes with virtually any color or outfit. It may be one of the most common minerals on earth, but what a designer can do with this gem is hardly ordinary—from breathtakingly huge rectangular cocktail rings to bracelets made of delicately strung beads to a pair of simple teardrop earrings.

### Tiger's-eye

Tiger's-eye gets its name from its surface, which seems to wink at you like a feline when it moves. The stone, for years relatively unnoticed by jewelry designers, has made a comeback, prowling the runways in both New York (Michael Kors) and Paris (Louis Vuitton). This earthy gem looks best in bold baubles like chunky bracelets and necklaces. ■
