# Pretty in purple

Purple reigns supreme on the color scene

The latest color forecast is in, and looming large on the home décor front is purple. Popular across the board at European fall markets, the trend has finally landed stateside.

From quiet lilacs to prominent plums, designers are infusing their latest creations with sophisticated shades of this royal hue.



**1** Scalloping and lace braid edging add a delicate touch to the Yves Delorme Violette bedding collection, \$50 to \$625. The linens feature dainty violets on a snowy-white background, with an all-over floral pattern.



**2** The whimsical etched flowers in Kenzo's Akiko glass, \$30 and \$32.50, are adapted from the line's floral dinnerware pattern. It's available in medium and large sizes and four additional colors.



**4** From the Esque Collect line by Esque Design, each Massif 2 vase, \$840, is a one-of-a-kind piece. The glass is blown into a plaster mold for texture and then manipulated into a unique form by heating and twisting.

**3** Playful shapes and colors spice up the Dew Drops rug by Christine Van Der Hurd, \$5,400 for a 6-foot by 9-foot piece. Part of the Follow the Drops collection, the hand-knotted rug is made of wool with silk detailing.



**5** Even when switched off, the Aqua pendant lamp by jGoodDesign, starting at \$935, brightens a room. The handblown piece is available in a range of colors and as a pendant or a standing lamp.
